



After careful consideration and a thorough review of the increased costs necessary to provide reliable essential services, support the increase of load in our service territory, and to meet the state's climate mandates, Turlock Irrigation District is considering a rate increase for the **first time in 10 years**.

Rather than recommend one large increase, TID will ask the Board of Directors to consider incorporating the total necessary increase over the next three years. TID has 27 different rate types or tariffs. Each rate type was evaluated based on the cost to provide service to that group and each will be effected differently by the rate update. 
Proposed Rate Increases Over the Next Three Years





How Our Rates Compare

As your community-owned utility, TID has worked hard to provide the lowest electric rates in the region and some of the lowest throughout the state. If the proposed rate increases are approved, TID rates would still be the lowest each year compared to other utilities' 2025 rates.

Rates shown include the base rate and the standard fees and surcharges each utility imposes.

The bill impacts for both residential and non-residential customers will depend on how much electricity customers use each month.

Additional proposed updates to TID rates and fees:

- The residential **Customer Charge** which is represented as a flat fee, is proposed to increase from the current \$17 to \$22 in 2025, \$26 in 2026 and \$30 in 2027. The Customer Charge will be different depending on the type of rate.
- TID is proposing to remove the previous **Environmental Charge**, which was initiated to help TID recover the cost of meeting renewable mandates. This cost has now been factored into the overall cost to provide service.
- The **Power Supply Adjustment** (PSA) will be reset from a half cent credit to a zero charge.

CARES

Residential customers who qualify for the TID CARES Program in 2025 are anticipated to receive a \$16 discount on the residential Customer Charge, as well as 15% off the first 800 kilowatt-hours (kWh) of use each month.

TID Medical Rate Discount

The Medical Rate Assistance Program reduces the rate for the first 500 kilowatt hours of monthly energy use by 50% if a full-time resident in the home must use a medical life-support device, or medical condition requires special heating or air conditioning in order to sustain life.
